Jeffery P. Reynolds was the lead counsel in the defense of Total Petrochemicals USA Inc. in a case which was the longest jury trial in Lamar County history. He won a defense verdict in the 2008 case that alleged Total Petrochemicals USA had stolen natural gas through a well casing leak in a Lamar County well.

After a trial that lasted nearly two months, the jury found no liability for Total.

Reynolds is an excellent trial attorney, who delivered great results for Total in a high-stakes case, said Tom Ryan, then General Counsel for Total E&P USA Inc.

“He works extremely well with experts in developing ways to deliver highly technical testimony at a level easily understood by jurors,” Ryan said. “He has the ability to build a strong rapport with a jury, and is a very persuasive and credible advocate.”
